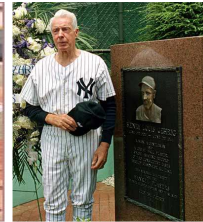
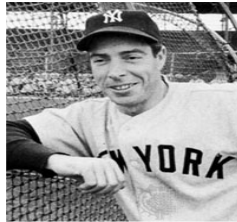
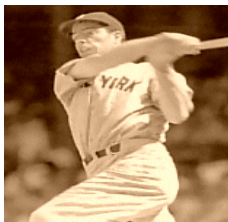

Milestones of Italian American History

Joe DiMaggio, One of the Greatest Players of All Time, Sets Record for Hitting Safely in 56 Consecutive Games



Decades after his career ended the DiMaggio name continues to be magic. Arguably the greatest player of his time **Joseph Paul DiMaggio** (1914-1999) was born one of nine children in Martinez, California, the son of parents who migrated from Isola delle Femmine, Sicily in 1902. Much to the consternation of his father, Joe, wanted to play baseball. Beginning in 1933 with the New York Yankee minor league franchise, the San Francisco Seals, he instantly excelled in batting, fielding, and base running, all with impeccable style that would become his trademark. He joined the Yankees in 1936, where he was heralded as the most anticipated major league rookie since Ty Cobb, and rapidly became a star player and worthy successor to immortals Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig.

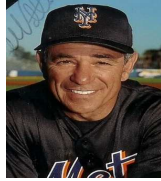
A stellar batting average in his first three years set the stage for winning three Most Valuable Player awards. 1941 saw Joe re-write baseball history by hitting safely in 56 straight games --arguably baseball's greatest feat. Joe's eminent talent, moreover, was matched by peerless grace, gentlemanly demeanor, and admirable dignity --legendary attributes whose relative absence in contemporary sports is lamented. Entering the Army in the Second World War, Joe resumed his baseball career after the war enjoying a superb season in 1948, finally ending his playing days in 1951.

He continued to remain in the public eye in baseball as a batting coach for the Yankees, as vice-president of the Oakland Athletics, and through his many commercials. The esteem with which he was regarded is evident by a 1969 White House award when he was named the Greatest Living Baseball Player.

At the top of his game, he also became a folk hero and won the esteem of baseball colleagues who regarded him as the "yardstick of success." These winning attributes were significant for Italian Americans affronted by decades of being held in low esteem as superstitious, ignorant, buffoons, or gangsters. First generation Italian Americans, although ignorant of baseball, nevertheless, boasted of DiMaggio as one whose intrepid performance on the field contradicted prevailing stereotypes and brought them pride. Even more meaningful to the second generation in the teeming cities, DiMaggio was one with whom they identify -one that commanded respect and validated their own Americanism. He was their undisputed hero. DiMaggio was of course, not the only Italian American to excel in the sport; one can cite among many others, **Yogi Berra, Phil Rizzuto, Sal Maglie, Carl Furillo, Joe Torre, Jason Giambi, and Mike Piazza.**

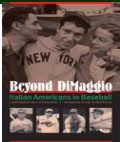

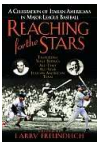

***Beyond DiMaggio: Italian Americans in Baseball*, by Lawrence A Baldassaro.**

Lincoln, NE, University of Nebraska Press, 2011.

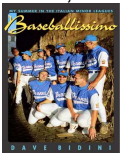
Lawrence Baldassaro, Emeritus Professor of Italian Studies at the University of Wisconsin – Milwaukee, tells the stories of Italian Americans' contributions to the game, from Joe DiMaggio, who transcended his ethnic identity to become an American icon, to A. Bartlett Giamatti, who served as commissioner of baseball, to Mike Piazza, considered the greatest hitting catcher ever. Berra, Rizzuto, Lasorda, Torre, Conigliaro, Santo, Piazza. Casual baseball fans—in fact, even many nonfans—know these names, not as Italian Americans, but as some of the most colorful figures in Major League Baseball. Ever since future Hall of Famer Tony Lazzeri became a key part of the Yankees' Murderers' Row lineup of 1926, Italian Americans have been among the most prominent and intriguing players in the game. The first comprehensive study of the topic, *Beyond DiMaggio* is also a social history of baseball, tracing the evolution of American perceptions toward those of Italian descent as it chronicles the baseball exploits that influenced those perceptions.



***Reaching for the Stars: A Celebration of Italian Americans in Major League Baseball*, by Larry Freundlich**

New York, Ballantine Books, 2003

This collection offers personal and sentimental essays about Italian-American baseball greats in the first part of the book, beginning in 1897 with Philadelphia Phillies' infielder Edward James Abbatichio, up through Ping Bodie (Francesco Stefano Pezzolo) and the bear-like 1930s Cincinnati Reds catcher Ernie Lombardi, to Al Gionfriddo, the Dodgers left fielder who played against the Yankees in the 1947 World Series. Honig lists the Italian-American Hall of Famers: Joe DiMaggio, Yogi Berra, Ernie Lombardi, Phil Rizzuto, Tommy Lasorda and Tony Lazzeri, with Mike Piazza and Joe Torre.



***Baseballissimo: My Summer in the Italian Minor Leagues*, by Dave Bidini.**

Toronto, Ontario, McClelland & Stewart, 2005

In the spring of 2002, Dave Bidini set off for Nettuno, Italy, with his wife, Janet, and their two small children, in search of his favorite summer game, baseball. Nettuno was his destination because this town, south of Rome, has been the baseball capital of Italy since 1944, when the game was introduced by the American GIs. In Nettuno, they love the game so much that they hand out baseball gloves and bats to children taking their first communion. For six months Bidini followed the fortunes of the Serie B Peones, Nettunese to the core. At the same time he was also learning about his own heritage, having spent his youth vigorously ignoring his Italianness. The result of his summer in Italy is vintage Bidini: a funny, perceptive, and engrossing book that takes readers far beyond the professional sport to the game that people around the world love to play
